

The kits are available at no cost.

They contain a five-panel urinalysis drug screen, directions on how to administer it, steps to take if the test is positive or negative, local resource information and websites that provide parental support and promote prevention.

The EAKs are easy for Fountain Hills parents to obtain and designed to be discreet.

With less than a month remaining in the school year and summer just around the corner, the coalition wanted to remind families about the Early Action Kits.

"The kit gives families a private way to obtain information and make decisions on how to move forward," said Maria Perreault, program manager for the coalition.

"Parents don't need to give any information when picking up a kit.

"There is no obligation and no one will contact you. Just ask for a kit – that's it. "And parents need to understand they are not alone. There is help available.

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration cites one report concerning substance abuse and the summer months.

The first indicates that vouths between the ages of 12 and 17 are far more likely to start using most substances during the summer than during others parts of the year.

On an average day in June and July, more than 11,000 adolescents aged 12 to 17 use alcohol for the first time – December is the only other month with

Similarly in June and July, an average of 5,000 youths smoke cigarettes for the first time, as opposed to the daily average of about 3,000 to 4,000 adolescents during the rest of the year.

'More free time and less adult supervision can make the summertime an exciting time for many young people, but it can also increase the likelihood of exposure to the dangers of substance abuse," said SAMHSA Adminstrator Pamela Hyde.
