

Falcon football suffers loss to Casteel

It was a rough night on the road Friday, Oct. 7, as the Falcons made their way to take on the team from Casteel and ultimately suffered a defeat, 57-6.

According to head coach John Flynn, it was a game the local squad should have won. Following two big wins at home, however, the Falcons just didn't seem to play with a lot of heart when squaring off against their most recent road opponents.

Casteel went up 7-6 early on in the first quarter and, according to Flynn, an unsuccessful next series from the Falcons seemed to take all of the wind out of their sails and it remained that way throughout the

rest of the competition.

The Falcons wound up down 21-6 after the first, with Casteel scoring another 19 unanswered points before the half came to a close. That trend continued following halftime, with the Falcons losing quarters three and four by respective scores of 10-0 and 7-0.

The local boys couldn't seem to connect in the air this outing, with quarterback Garrett Renner only going two for 11 with seven yards.

The ground game was quite a bit better, with Daniel Butler carrying 11 for 106 yards.

As for defense, Andrew Hoyt led the charge with eight tackles and a pair of assists while Eddie Flores put in seven tackles and three assists. Kainoa Reid

chipped in with six tackles of his own and an assist for good measure.

Coach Flynn was clearly frustrated with the outcome, as the Falcons proved unable to keep up with a team made entirely of freshmen and sophomores.

"That was the first and only time we'll play Casteel," Flynn said. "They'll be out of our region next year. Next year they'll have a junior class and they'll have to move up to 6A."

Flynn said Casteel was a solid team, though not on par with some of the squads the Falcons have faced so far this season.

"We suffered eight significant injuries in the first half on both sides of the ball, which set us back,"

Flynn said. "We weren't able to switch over and run double tight like we had hoped. We had issues with our center, unable to snap the ball and, well, it is what it is."

Flynn said Flynn's impressive rushing was the only highlight from the night, including a 56-yard touchdown run to help get the game going.

"We don't practice until Wednesday, which was planned, and we're hoping to get a lot of our guys back," Flynn said. "I think we've lost one for sure, due to a concussion, but the other guys were just bumped and bruised."

"Were they bigger than us? Probably not. Were they stronger than us? Yes. But did they have a greater will to win? Absolutely. And

that's frustrating."

Flynn said that, as the season comes to a close, the team will be making some wholesale changes to defense that, while it won't necessarily be a perfect fit for every situation, will allow the team to experiment and find the right combination of players in the right

positions.

Next up, the Falcons hit the road to take on Valley Christian this Friday, Oct. 14, beginning at 7 p.m. The final two games of the regular season will be back on the home field, with the local boys welcoming ASU Prep on Oct. 21 and Yuma Catholic on Oct. 28.
