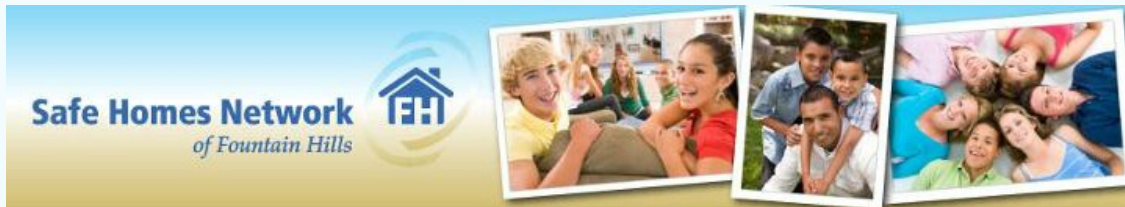
The FH Coalition is co-sponsoring the next Middle School Madness event on January 31st from 6-9 PM at FH Middle School
